Letter from the Executive Director

Dear Friends and Supporters of ARS,

Tempest fugues, as we all know, and though you have not heard from us for a while we have been very busy working on the issues most important to ARS and serving those who need the assistance and services we provide. The past year has been an exciting, and often challenging, time for our agency with New Hampshire state funding being of the most concern to us for fiscal year 2011. Although funding had been provided for fiscal years 2010 and 2011 by the N.H. Legislature in 2009, budget shortfalls in 2010 threatened our funding for 2011 as the legislature and Governor Lynch worked to reduce the state's deficit. In the end, however, funding was restored for 2011 with the help of many N.H. Representatives and Senators, most notably Sen. Martha Fuller Clark, all of whom understand the importance of continued financial support for the state's five AIDS Service Organizations. Without this financial support we at ARS would not be able to provide many of the services we do for the men and woman of the Seacoast region living with HIV and AIDS. Although we are "safe" for this fiscal year, which ends June 30th of 2011, the continued financial support from the State of New Hampshire for future years is uncertain and many feel in jeopardy.

On a brighter note, the Board of Directors is hard at work preparing for the 25th Annual Twilight Auction to be held on Saturday, November 13th at the new Residence Inn in Portsmouth. Please show your support for this milestone event by attending, and as they say..."bid high and bid often". There is more information about all of our upcoming events elsewhere in this newsletter.

We thank you for your past support and are hopeful that we can count on you in the future. Please watch for our Annual Appeal which will be mailed in November. We are pleased to announce that AIDS Response Seacoast is now approved to offer OraQuick ADVANCE® Rapid HIV-1/2 Antibody Tests which detects antibodies to HIV-1 and HIV-2. OraQuick® provides results in 20 minutes, enabling individuals to learn their status in a single visit and allows HIV positive persons to be connected to immediate care. 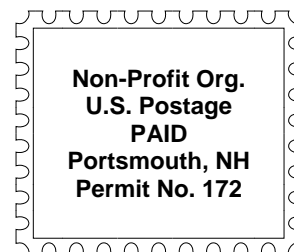

ARS Client Services

Case management, provided by our Client Services Department, is available to people at all stages of HIV disease. Case managers work with clients to assist in the coordination of needed social and medical services, provide linkage to other area human services agencies, and help in the organization of a care plan. An important component of case management involves assisting clients through complex medical and social systems to access needed resources. Emphasis is placed on improving individual quality of life and supporting client-centered decision making. Case managers strive to provide current information and consistent support to the client, their partners and loved ones. Case management services include:

- Direct financial support for housing, fuel, transportation to medical appointments, mental health and substance abuse counseling.
- Education and information about HIV disease, transmission, and prevention.
- Linkage with direct service volunteers for practical support such as rides to medical and other appointments, housekeeping, daily chores or moving.
- Assistance with applying for Social Security, Disability, Medicaid and food stamps; and other eligible programs.
- Referrals for medical and dental/oral care and treatment; mental health services (individual and group support, drug and alcohol treatment); assistance with advanced directives and estate planning; emergency financial assistance for eligible persons; complementary therapies (acupuncture, massage therapy and others); vision care.
- Collaboration on referrals to medical professionals in the seacoast area.
